Dear Parents and Guardians,

We have been growing as a school which is very encouraging—we are full in every year group apart from Year 8. As a result, we have increased the size of the team providing supervision at lunchtimes, even so, I heard from one family that pupils said they couldn't find a supervisor. As a result, our Lunch Hour Supervisors (LHS) now wear pink tabards so they are more easily seen in their roles in the playground and dining hall. We employ 6 LHS in total but we are recruiting for one more. There are more adults than just the LHS in the playground because a member of staff is always out there and we also have at least three staff monitoring individual children. In addition to the staff monitoring playground behaviour, there are always over 100 pupils in lunchtime clubs being supervised by staff. Finally, we have asked one of our LHS to stand in the Year 5 playground so they are easily visible. Previously, the LHS had stood within line of sight but it seems some pupils weren't aware, hence the change. I hope this reassures any of you who weren't sure about our arrangements.

One of the advantages of being part of the Wimborne Academy Trust is that the school is monitored not just by our own staff but also by external challenge. Partners. We have a visit from a trained Ofsted inspector once a term; half termly visits from the CEO and also regular visits from the Specialist Leads in Education who support the development of the English and Maths teams. It is great to hear feedback on how the school is growing from strength to strength and I want to take this opportunity to thank my excellent team of teachers and support staff for the work they do.

Alice in Wonderland is happening! The rehearsals are in full flow, pupils are learning their lines and dance moves and are constructing sets and costumes. It promises to be another amazing St Michael's production and we'll let you know as soon as tickets go on sale.
