Dear Parents and Guardians,

I would like to thank you for all your support this term. Pupils have worked hard and their progress in work is excellent to see. You will know from the news that, like many other sectors of society, education is facing its toughest time with rising costs, static budgets and significantly increased expectations from Ofsted. In such a toxic mixture I would just like to publicly thank the staff at St Michael's for their commitment and determination in doing what is best for your children. We calculated recently that over 94% of our pupils attend a club or activity every week which is quite remarkable given that these are all run voluntarily.

I will shortly be writing to you with our new Anti-Bullying Policy and procedures. I am delighted that our new Buddy+ system is in place, as is the letter box for pupils to self refer so pupils have every opportunity to share if they are feeling anxious in school. In addition a group of our Year 8 students have started a letter club where pupils can write to 'Dear Charlie' about any concerns and they will reply. We have trained students and they have a direct line of report to our Welfare Team. The policy is currently being reviewed by the School Council who are also producing a pamphlet to make the policy more accessible to younger minds.

Can I take this opportunity to apologise to those of you who received Attendance Letters that weren't in confidential envelopes—that was a mistake on our part. School attendance is now a major stream within Ofsted inspections and any pupil who drops below 96%, which is equivalent to one day every two weeks or one weeks holiday in a half term, will receive a letter as per the guidance documents. If the attendance does not improve within three weeks of that first letter then you will be asked to come to school for a Review Meeting with the Dorset Attendance Officer. The reason for this is that there is a correlation between good attendance and attainment and I thank you for your support in ensuring your children are in school.
