

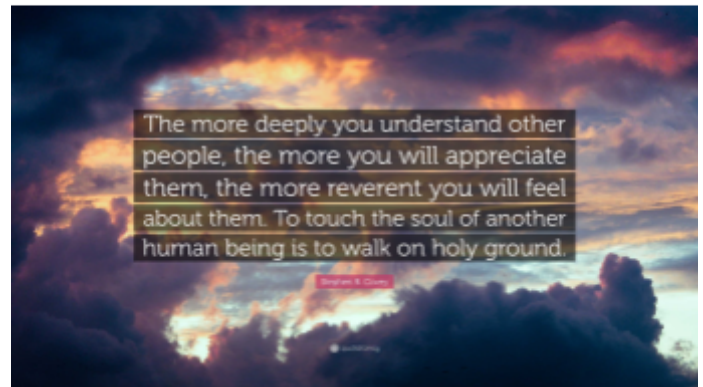
Collective Worship
