The Eco Team also ran a whole school collective worship this week. They spoke to us about the work they have been doing in and around school, including testing the level of air pollution and how to look for signs of clean air. They encouraged us to fix our bike punctures rather than replacing inner tubes. There are plans to plant a substantial number of new trees on our school site as well as decorate some drains in the local area! The team also promoted our uniform swap.

On Wednesday we celebrated World Book Day and welcomed many wonderful book characters into school. We were so impressed with the creativity in the costumes that were produced! Mr Bush and Mrs Odgers led the collective worship where we were encouraged to read as it helps to develop our sense of empathy towards others, which ultimately means us all getting along better together. We celebrated International Women's Day on Friday during collective worship. We considered the importance of this day and reflected on the theme of 'Inspiring Inclusion'.
