

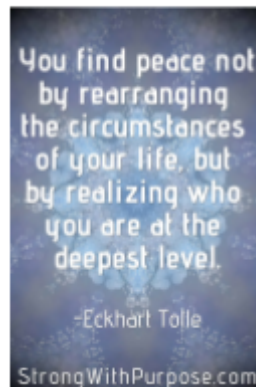
Collective Worship
