Dear Parents and Guardians,

Welcome or indeed welcome back to St Michael's. We have had a very positive first couple of days and I am delighted to have seen so many smiley faces. It's not just Year 5 where there have been new faces either because not only did very few leave us for Grammar school we have also have had over 17 pupils join in other year groups making school a very busy place!

One of our most important tools for communication are the Personal Notebooks (PNB's) and we have introduced some more pages this year. As well as signing your child's homework and checking how they are getting on with their credit marks (p9) please checkout pages 100-105 as there is additional information regarding Maths and English. You will be aware that the Government has made passing the maths tests harder at all ages up to GCSE and so if your child does not have homework there is always the opportunity to use mymaths.co.uk and all the login information is on p100.

ABC– Aspiration, Belief and Creativity are the core values at this school and I ask for your support in helping children to allow these attributes to flourish. A key part of this is attending clubs. The old adage that 'the more you put in the more you get out' is so true in school and so please look down the clubs list and encourage your child to participate in at least one club at St Michael's.

I am delighted that we are able to invest in the school playgrounds this year. You may be aware that we have had the diggers in the Quiet Zone (QZ) as we have begun work moving Sophie's Garden into the QZ and we are also going to be building a themed 'values' garden to celebrate and promote the core values of our school. I am grateful to the school PTA who have raised considerable funds towards turning the area that was Sophie's Garden into a much more active play area.

NB Level of work: Please can I ask you to bear with us if your child is saying the work is not hard enough. On the one hand I don't want children to get demoralised but one of the effects of the new expectations in the Government assessments is that basic skills need to be applied with a much greater degree of accuracy. Consequently, for example, spellings, such as the homophones on pages 104 & 105 in the PNB have to be 100% accurate. This means that some lessons will have as part of their objectives things that your child might think of as 'easy'. That said the whole lesson should not feel simple and boring and all teachers should be setting 'challenge objectives' as well as the core

Traffic Outside school:

As you will all be aware the traffic outside school can be very dangerous. I encourage you all to consider dropping off and collecting pupils further away from school. It would be good exercise for them and safer all round. The following roads all have pavements and would not involve pupils having to cross a road without a Crossing Patrol: Lonnen Rd on the Co-op side, New Merrifield, Cobbs Rd and the top of Beaucroft Lane (there is a cut through to Wimborne Road). There also the following roads where you can drop pupils off and they would only have to cross residential roads which don't have through traffic: outside Colehill Library and to the south of school at Greenhill Lane. Finally, you could go slightly further to Giddy Lake, Onslow Gardens or even Lacy Drive where there is a cut through to the steep but healthy Onslow Gardens; with these locations there would be one road to cross along side the Colehill Cricket Club.

One parent has spoken to me with the idea of trying to encourage a voluntary one way system along Colehill Lane at school collecting time. As parents last year will know I have met with both the Parish Council and Dorset Council road safety and not had much success. Please contact me if you feel a voluntary one way system would <u>not</u> work
